
need to find out for themselves.

Statement of intent

The spiral curriculum is incrementally sequenced so that knowledge and skills will build on previous learning and fundamental ideas are repeatedly revisited. Music at Boxgrove offers all children opportunities for listening and appraising, performing, improvising and composing. Music is a subject that by its very nature is already differentiated with children all playing different parts in, for example, a whole class ensemble. We want all children to be able to express their creativity and enjoy making music together, using different instruments, including their voice. We believe that participation in musical learning will have a direct impact on their well-being.
