WHAT WE HAVE BEEN UP TO THIS WEEK

YEAR R - This week saw the children come together as a whole class. The children have enjoyed getting to know each other and have been forging further friendships. There was great excitement as the children headed over to the swimming pool for their first lesson. Mrs Gurney, Mrs Illingworth and Mrs Tait were extremely impressed by their enthusiasm. The children have also been studying Michael Rosen's story 'We're going on a Bear Hunt' which was enjoyed by all.

YEAR 3 - On Thursday the children spent the day immersed in what it would have been like to have lived in the Stoneage. During the day they had the opportunity to create some Stoneage jewelry, handle real artefacts and observe how fire was created. They also had the opportunity to taste some smoked mackerel over a campfire!

YEAR 4 - As part of their georgraphy lessons the children have been learning all about the journey of a river - from its source, to its mouth. The children have already started to create models ready to label the different parts of a river next week. Staff have been impressed by their attention to detail and creativity.
