WHAT WE HAVE BEEN UP TO THIS WEEK

YEAR 1 - After looking at their own 'special' books this week during RE the children looked at the special book called 'The Torah'. During their learning the children enjoyed studying Hebrew writing and learning about the way it is read with a yad (yad is Hebrew for finger). The children also enjoyed creating their own Torah artwork.

YEAR 3 - This week during science Year 3 have been testing the impact of friction on a variety of surfaces. They quickly discovered that the rougher the surface the slower the object. Why not have a go at home with items from around the home with your child/ren to see what you discover. The children and staff are also enjoying their new class reader, 'The Iron Man'.

YEAR 5 - During English the children have been focusing on writing non chronological reports. They have enjoyed using relative clauses and fronted adverbials to tell staff all about cold climate animals. Please ask your child which animal they chose. Staff have been exceedingly impressed by their reports and look forward to seeing their finished work next week. Please pop into your child's class at the end of next week if you would like to see their finished reports.

SWIMMING - It is lovely to see all of the children back in the swimming pool. This term Key Stage 2 will be working on swimming a continuous distance using the neat strokes they worked hard on last term. Distance badge progress slips will be given out after May half term. In Key Stage 1 the children are developing their strokes and water confidence with most of Year 2 swimming in lengths and some of Year 1 moving into the deep end. Reception children are swimming on their fronts and backs, and getting very good at putting their faces in the water and blowing bubbles - why not get them to show you in the bath?!

Lewis, Year 3 recently had an exciting week of football. Lewis has been training at Chelsea's pre-academy for over a year now and was invited to a Christmas party with the men's first team. RSPB BIG GARDEN BIRDWATCH - Across the UK, over 600,000 people took part in Big Garden Birdwatch 2024, counting a whopping 9.7 million birds! House Sparrows took the top spot, but counts of these chirpy birds are down by 60% compared to the first Birdwatch in 1979. In fact, we've lost 38 million birds from UK skies in the last 60 years. With birds facing so many challenges, it's more important than ever to get involved in the Birdwatch. Every bird you do – or don't – count will give The RSPB a valuable insight into how garden birds are fairing. Spend an hour watching the birds in your garden between **24 and 26 January 2025** and record the birds that land. Please click here to find out more.
