### Be prepared for school!

Please ensure that your child has the following in school every day:

- Trainers to wear at break and lunchtime.
- Water bottle.
- Fruit / vegetable snack or rice cakes for break time (optional).
- Coat for cooler / wet days.
- Fully stocked pencil case: this would include a blue handwriting pen and a spare blue handwriting pen, pencils, eraser, pencil sharpener and a small glue stick.
- Please remember to order a lunch for your child.

### Home Learning/Reading

Homework is released every Wednesday on Seesaw, following a similar structure to last academic year and is due in by Monday. Children should work in their home learning books and upload photos onto Seesaw

Children should also read regularly at home. We have copies of the "Top 150 books" in school for them to borrow and a whole range of other books too. If your child finds reading a challenge, please support them by reading with them at least 3 times per week.

#### <u> PE</u>

PE will be on Wednesdays this term. Your child should arrive in their Boxgrove PE kit and ensure that they have both trainers and indoor shoes to wear. They may wish to wear an additional layer under their Boxgrove hoodie to keep warm in the classroom. **Please bring in an extra pair of shoes for your child on PE days so they have a clean pair after PE.** 

#### Water bottle

Please ensure your child brings a full water bottle every day as they are not permitted to use the water fountains.

#### **Trainers**

All children must have a spare pair of outdoor shoes kept at school each day to change into at break and lunchtime, to ensure that the classrooms are kept clean. This includes PE days. If your child arrives in their PE trainers, they must have a change of shoes to wear inside (e.g. school shoes).
