Re: WORLD BOOK DAY

We are really looking forward to celebrating World Book Day a week earlier this year on Thursday 27 February and have lots of exciting activities for the children on that day and in that week. The theme this year is **Read Your Way**.

Research shows that children see reading as something they *have* to do, rather than something they *choose* to do. The World Book Day 'Read Your Way' campaign encourages everyone to let go of reading pressures and expectations and empowers children and young people to have fun discovering reading on their own terms. World Book Day believes that children are more likely to love reading if:

- · Someone reads to them regularly
- They find time to read
- They have books at home and at school
- They know a trusted person who can help them find the right books
- · We make reading fun for them
- They are given a choice in what they read.

We hope the children will be able to 'read their way' over this week. Below is an outline of some of the activities the children will be taking part in.

# Tuesday 25 February - visit from the poet Joshua Siegal

This will take place in the Kent Hall in year groups – you can visit his website to read and listen to some of his poetry. https://www.joshuasiegal.co.uk/

He will also be available for a meet and greet and will sign books for you to purchase at the end of the day in the **school library**.

## Poetry focus for English

Our English lessons for the week beginning 24 February will focus on Poetry; reading poems, finding out about different poets and writing some poetry in classes to share.

### On Thursday 27 February - World Book Day! DRESS UP as your favourite book character. (OPTIONAL)

We know that many people like to come dressed as their favourite book character but some children prefer not to dress up. If that is the case the children can wear own home clothes or remain in school uniform. If you would like help with finding an outfit please speak to your class teacher. The Scholastic book fair will be returning from Wednesday 26 February until Monday 3 March selling books for you to purchase. The children can use their vouchers to receive £1 off any book. It will be held outside the large hall (Kent Hall) on the dates above from 3.10pm - 3.45pm.
