### WHAT WE HAVE BEEN UP TO THIS WEEK...

**YEAR 1** - During Maths the children have been exploring capacity whilst using a variety of containers. There was lots of excitement as they poured, filled, and compared their containers to discover which of them could hold the most water. Through this 'hands-on' investigation the children quickly began making predictions and confidently worked out the answers for themselves! They will now start to look at full, half and quarter capacity.

**YEAR 3** - Spring has truly sprung in Year 3! This week in Science, the children learned about the function of plant stems and their important role in transporting water and nutrients through the plant. To support their learning they carried out a practical experiment using celery, water, and food colouring to observe how water moves up the stem. As the coloured water travelled through the celery there were lots of gasps and amazement as they watched the changes appear before their very eyes. What a wonderful way to help them understand how stems support a plant's growth and survival. Why not give it a go at home to see for yourselves.

**YEAR 5** - During English the children have been writing balanced arguments based on Sir Ernest Shackleton's Endurance Expedition to the Antarctic. Using their new found knowledge the children were able to debate the pros and cons of the expedition and make informed decisions as to whether or not the expedition was successful. The children have thoroughly enjoyed learning all about Shackleton and his journey.



### A HUGE THANK YOU...

A huge thank you to the Mitchell family who, on Sunday, organised their second litter pick of the school grounds. This time they recruited others and became a team of 25(!) and were able to tidy-up most of the school site. From all of us to all of you, **THANK YOU** to everyone who took part. 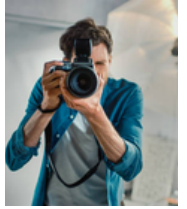

## BECOME A WALKING INSTRUCTOR WITH SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL
